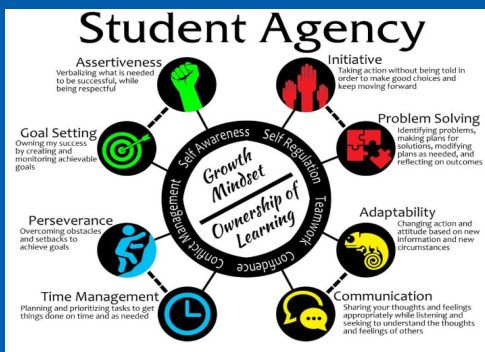
### GRADE LEVEL HIGHLIGHTS
